

VI Connection System

How are panels stacked and connected to create exhibits?

No tools are required. Panels are easily joined with color-coded heavy-duty plastic pins. One pin is used at the bottom of the panel and one at the top to join and stack the panels.

VII Lighting and Accessories

What types of lights are available for ExpoModular?

A variety of halogen, incandescent and fluorescent flood lights, spot lights and back lights are available. Your ExpoModular designer will recommend the best light for your specific needs and budget.

VIII Countertops

How are countertops constructed?

Countertops may be customized, but are normally constructed from laminated 3/4" birch plywood with t-molding or laminated edges. Countertops normally have a 3/4" overhang and a total thickness of 1.5"

What laminate options are available for countertops?

The same laminates available for ExpoModular panels may also be used on countertops. See "What laminates are available?" section under the "Fabric and Laminate Choices" section above.

How do countertops attach?

This varies depending upon the application, but normally they attach to the back wall panels using an "L" bracket, and to podiums and cabinets using a 3/4" overhand to hold the top in place.

Can I add an inlaid logo to a countertop?

Yes. Prices vary by laminate choice and complexity of the logo. Please contact your Expo Designer for a quote.

Are grommets available?

Yes. Grommet holes and grommets are available upon request and are used to add a finished look when run wiring through countertops and back walls.

IX Cases, Crates and Shipping Tubs

How are systems packed and shipped?

Three choices are available: wheeled shipping cases (Item #SC50), wheeled shipping tubs (Item #SC60) and custom wooden crates (custom built to specifications). SC50 cases may be shipped UPS/FedEx and are transportable in most vehicles; while SC60 tubs and wooden crates must be shipped via freight line. *Because ExpoDisplays does not recommend shipping components with a non-fabric finish in the SC60 tub, Expo will not do so without written removal of liability to do so.

Are there limitations we should consider when selecting a shipping method?

Systems contain panels larger than 23" x 46" or 24", 32" or 57" radius curves must pack in SC60 cases (outside dimensions 52" x 53" x 31.5") or crates (custom built to specifications).

SC60 cases and/or crates must ship freight.

*Shipping method can be a significant factor in design. Please verify desired shipping methods with your client at the beginning of the design process.

X Production Time

How long does it take to get an ExpoModular display built and shipped?

Production time varies according to Expo's current production schedule and the complexity of the design, but following are some general guidelines: 10' x 10' and smaller - 20 business days to ship, 10' x 20' - 30 business days to ship; larger than 10' x 20' - 45 business days to ship. Orders needing to be shipped sooner may incur a Priority Processing fee of 2.5% per day. In many cases, orders can be shipped sooner with no Priority Processing fees. Your Expo Designer will quote current turnaround times upon request.
